SUP enthusiasts and cyclists can once again take their paddleboards and bikes aboard the boats and as always dogs are welcome. Every season offers a patchwork of spectacular colour and rich habitat for native wildlife.

"We are excited to be one of the first attractions in the area to be using WishTrip," says Lisa Braithwaite, Ullswater Steamers Attractions Marketing & Events Manager. "It's aimed at independent travellers who are tech savvy and want the freedom to

instantly share their experiences with others or get recommendations from peers. It replaces our older walking app and we are encouraging our visitors to give it a go and share their Lake District holiday memories."

The Adventure Smart campaign has useful tips for anyone heading out on land or water in the Lake District.
